
Risk Game Logic Grid Puzzle



Four friends spent the night playing Risk. Each one of them has the objective to wipe out an enemy army. Can you tell which player conquered more territories?

- 1. Each player must destroy an army of a different color.
- 2. No pair of players are mutual enemies.
- **3.** Chad has one territory more than the player in charge of the green army. Chad's target isn't red.
- 4. The purple player must destroy the red or black player.
- 5. The black player has 2 more territories than Benson.

- 6. Tyler has 2 fewer territories than his enemy.
- 7. Logan either is black or must destroy the black army.
- **8**. The player with 10 territories is controlling the green or purple army. His objective isn't the red army.
- 9. The player aiming to destroy Logan has the red army.
